



The demand for musculoskeletal (MSK) services for muscles, joints and bones continues to increase year on year.

What we are doing

Patients have told us that they want to be able to access healthcare services closer to home, and that they want to be seen by the right person, first time. This public feedback and insight has fed into the development of a new scheme that offers patients direct access to physiotherapists.

The First Contact Practitioners scheme has physiotherapists based in GP surgeries as a first point of contact for people with MSK conditions. Having physiotherapists as part of the primary care workforce means there are no unnecessary delays for patients accessing the specialised care they need, closer to where they live.



What next?

The First Contact Practitioners scheme is currently being trialled in several GP practices in Leeds but will be rolled out across West Yorkshire and Harrogate over the next few years. Physiotherapy is just one of many MSK services provided by a range of specialists that offer patients more options and a more integrated approach to healthcare.
